Jack Roosevelt Robinson was born on January 31, 1919 in Cairo, Georgia He was the youngest of five children Jackie's father left the family shortly after he was born and Jackie never saw him again His mother Millie raised him and his three brothers and one sister About a year after Jackie was born, the family moved to Pasadena, California
